
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Arriving on time

Class reviews

Year 5/6

Following the Year 6 Residential, where many of the children, conquered their fears, we have had an eventful week, with the rescue of a Hedgehog who was snuffling around in the car park on Tuesday. Miss Clark took the injured Hog to St Tiggywinkles to get medical attention - the class named it Sonic! Keeping the animal theme going, the children have completed some research to find out interesting facts about animals to help them in their persuasive writing - they need to convince the other children in KS2 that their chosen animal is the most important in the world! There have been some interesting thoughts on



animals - even the vulture and spiders are being considered! Moving into the Festive period, our RE learning is taking us on a journey through the Christmas Story, looking at it from different Biblical perspectives.

Year 4/5



So, this last week in Year 4/5 we have been researchers! Real researchers, can you believe it? We have also been finding fascinating facts and extraordinary evidence to use in our leaflet all about the local food bank. We have been looking more closely at persuasive writing and within this, focusing on some astonishing

alliterations and remarkable rhetorical questions. In our History lessons we have been learning all about crime and punishment. Students have been investigating how the police have change over time and looking at what used to be illegal.

Year 3/4



In Year 3/4, we have thoroughly enjoyed being scientists this week! The children have shown enthusiasm and thoughtful approaches to the unit on magnets and forces. It has been lovely to see the children designing their own science experiments to answer scientific questions they have come up with: How can you tell a

magnet from a magnetic material? Which magnet is the strongest? Are magnets just as powerful underwater as they are through the air? Which materials are magnetic? Are big magnets more powerful that small ones?

Year 2



Year 2 continue to be superstars and show a real enthusiasm for learning. Recently we have started to look further into the events of the Great fire of London, discovering the key events that led to the fire and who Samuel Pepys was. In Maths, the children have continued to develop their physical and mental skills for adding and subtracting. As well as developing

our problem solving; remembering to read the question first!

Away from the classroom, it has been great to see the continued hard work with homework. Please keep reading, learning spellings, checking Timestable Rockstars and soon learning the Christmas play lines. We cannot wait to show you all!

Year 1



We have gone 'Castle Crazy' in Year 1! This term we are learning about Castles. We have built a castle big enough for us to play in and have built castles from Lego and building blocks. While doing this we learned lots of new vocabulary linked to castles, such as portcullis, drawbridge, moat, towers and turrets.

Reception and Nursery



Nursery and Reception enjoyed celebrating World Nursery Rhyme week and learnt a new nursery rhyme every day. Nursery made their own frogs and then jumped around like 5 Little Speckled frogs. They also went on a dog hunt, finding the dogs hidden outside and then using them to sing B.I.N.G.O while clapping along to the beat. Reception made their own fishing rods (1, 2, 3, 4, 5, Once I Caught A Fish Alive), fixed

Humpty Dumpty with plasters, danced along like animals to Old MacDonald Had A Farm and made a class bus with all sorts of passengers!

Teaching and Learning update

This term, our staff training has been focussed around helping our children 'know more and remember more' across the curriculum.

Teachers attended a fantastic session which focussed on the research behind, and the use of, 'retrieval practice' which helps children to recall what they have learnt in their lessons over a period of time. We talked about lots of different ways that we can support children with this in our lessons, for example using start of lesson recaps on 'sticky knowledge' and quizzing.

Evidence from research & experience from classes around the world tell us that retrieval practice is a highly effective strategy to support learning. We have linked below a great video which explains what retrieval practice is for parents and carers – please do take a look!

This week's recommendations are inspired by the kick off of the football World Cup! There are lots of other sporty books in our Reading Hive display and the non-fiction section of the school library.

'Changing the Game' by Casey Stoney is a really attractively-laid out set of biographies of successful female footballers, alongside inspirational quotations. A fantastic read if you've been inspired by the achievements of our Lionesses or would just like to find out more about the stories of determined women from a whole range of countries who have fought hard to play the beautiful game at the top level.

'Go! Go! Chichico' by Geraldine McCaughrean is a great story from the Little Gems collection which are printed in dyslexic-friendly fonts and on cream coloured paper to support those who find reading a little harder. Chichico is a young boy living in the slums of Brazil who gets the invitation of his dreams – to try out for Brazil's top team, Santos Brazil. Will he make it? Read it to find out! (AR: Book Level 3.4 / 2,9488 words / Age 5+)

'Tough Guys (Have Feelings Too)' by Keith Negley uses powerful images of different male figures to show that being physically big or strong doesn't mean you don't experience all the different human emotions. There's very little text in the book, but it really gets you thinking. A great book for starting a conversation about feelings and to bust some myths!

Accelerated Reader

The children have been continuing to quiz on their books and their combined word count is now over **three million words since September – incredible!**




