Focus on.....the Governors!

Local Governing Body – the LGB

Hello! My name is Jayne Bennion, and it's been my pleasure to be a Governor at Thameside Primary since September 2019. Last year, I also became the Chair of the LGB as well as the lead Governor



focussing on the Quality of Education. I am proud to be a Governor at Thameside Primary as it's a fantastic, welcoming school, and it's always such a pleasure to visit the school to see your children as they learn.

Who are the people on the LGB?

There are seven of us on the Governing Body at Thameside. Each person volunteers their time, and we meet six or seven times a year to discuss how well the school is doing and to work with Mrs Youngman and the senior leaders to make it even better.

We have two governors who are also parents of children at Thameside, (Lindsey Chegwidden & Richard Auburn) and one staff governor (Mrs Richardson). The rest of us (Ellie Ball, Paul Thompson, Sandra North and me) are appointed by the Vale Academy Trust. We work as a team and we all believe in the Thameside values and the importance of an exceptional education for each and every child.

What do Governors do?

Our job is to help the school with strategic direction and to ask questions of Mrs Youngman to make sure the school performance is continually improving. We also make sure the budget, staffing and policy are properly managed. We have specific governors who take a particular interest in Safeguarding and keep all of your children safe at school, as well as governors who keep a special eye on budgets, health and safety as well as important aspects of your child's education such as curriculum, attendance and behaviour.

Sports update!

Sport is flourishing this year at Thameside!

Over the last few weeks, we have competed in a swimming gala with Year 5 and 6 children; we have started a KS1 multi sports club and the girls in Year 1 and 2 have started taking part in Disney shooting stars at lunch time. This is just the tip of the iceberg!

'Disney Shooting Stars' is a program designed by both Disney and the Football Association (the FA), aimed at supporting girls to thrive in sport and improve their social skills. This is all done with a backdrop of the incredible Disney stories - we are currently using the 'Incredibles 2'. It has been great to see the reaction from the girls and the positive leadership from our Sports Leaders to support the development of the program.



We are extremely proud of the resilience and sporting behaviour shown by our swimming team at Radley Sports Centre. The children (pictured at the top of the newsletter) represented the school really well with some great results. This again demonstrates that sport and exercise have a vital role to play in many areas of a child's development, none more important than health and well-being. At Thameside, we have lots more exciting opportunities coming up in sport throughout the year including: a dance competition, flag football, football league fixtures and tennis competitions. Year 5/6

Getting our Science brains in gear this week, Year 5 have had to use their logical thinking to calculate how long it takes each planet to orbit the sun, as well as make a moveable model of the Earth's orbit - COSMIC! Peeling back the layers of the human body, Year 6 dramatised the flow of blood around the body,



then created life-size diagrams showing double circulation.

Year 4/5

In Anthony Horwitz class we have been continuing with our street art/Banksy work. In Art this week we were working on drawing letters in different graffiti styles focusing on different font types and shading. The sketches are all really, vibrant, unique and impressive. We may have the next Banksy in year 4/5!

In our year 4 Science, we have been focusing on all things sound. This week we explored pitch which is a very tricky concept to understand. We first investigated how the lengths of a ruler flicked on a table can change pitch. We noticed that pitch is all down to the speed of vibration. To finish the lesson we made straw flutes with different lengths of straw.



Year 3/4

In Michael Morpurgo class, we have had a very busy week using resources in school to help us with our learning. In Maths, Year 3 have been using different strategies and resources to divide 2-digit numbers by a 1-digit number, for example place value counters, Dienes and drawings, and we are now moving on to use flexible partitioning. In Science, Year 3 used scientific skills to make observations, used a measuring cylinder by trying to answer the question 'Why doesn't water drain away in some areas?'



Year 2

It's been a brilliant few weeks in Year 2! The children have been busy preparing to write their instructions for a disgusting sandwich ready for Mrs Youngman. Their ideas have been extremely creative, and the sandwich instructions truly are disgusting! In Maths, we have been exploring the use of money. The children have shown great resilience with this topic and the more exposure they can get at home to using money, the more this will support their development. Thank you for your support with this!

In Science we have started to explore animals and humans. The children have realised that science is everywhere and have enjoyed being 'scientists'. In P.E., we have continued to learn dance and dodgeball; look out for letters coming your way about the upcoming dance event! We were also extremely lucky that we had a brilliant afternoon with Sarah Coyle, the author, using our imagination and exploring her books.

As always, thank you for your support with your child's education and please do ask if we can help in any way.

Year 1

Our topic in Science is 'Animals including Humans.' We have been learning to name the different parts of our body. We drew around each other and wrote labels to show what we had learned and remembered.



Reception

This week Reception have been thinking about people who help us. We have been for a walk around school to ask the question 'How do you help?' and took lots of photos for our Big Book. We have also turned part of our classroom into a hospital and have been very kind and helpful at looking after each other!







Nursery

Nursery have enjoyed learning about Chinese New Year. We turned our role play area into a Chinese restaurant complete with woollen noodles and lots of other Chinese dishes. We have been exploring chopsticks and some of the children have been showing us all how to use them. We have also learnt about the culture and how to celebrate Chinese New Year; we even had a party and made rabbit ears for the 'year of the rabbit'.

After that we have been looking at The Gruffalo again as we are The Gruffalo class. We have been exploring the story and all of the characters from it. We have made a Gruffalo reward board to encourage the children to continue to make good choices – we are very proud of them already!



Year 6 have an extra opportunity to boost their word count at quizzing club, held every Wednesday morning from 8.15am!


Thameside Reading Wishlist at 'Mostly Books'

Strep A and Handwashing advice

It's important to minimise the spread of infection in schools and other education and childcare settings as much as possible, so we ask your support with

- If a child is unwell and has a fever, they should stay home from school or nursery until they feel better, and the fever has resolved.
- Teach children the importance of good hand hygiene, practice regular handwashing with soap and warm water.
- Catch coughs and sneezes in tissues then bin them is another simple way to help stop illness from spreading.
- Adults should also try to stay home when unwell and if they do have to go out, wear a face covering. When unwell don't visit healthcare settings or visit vulnerable people unless urgent.
- Remember that flu vaccination is still available for all eligible groups and is the best protection against the virus.



It is also essential that everyone washes their hands more often, using soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Hand washing with soap employs mechanical action that loosens bacteria and viruses from the skin, rinsing them into the drain. Drying hands afterwards makes the skin less hospitable to the virus.

Hand sanitiser can be effective if soap is not available or the situation makes using

soap less feasible (i.e., when outside).

Parent Governor Nominations

We will soon have a vacancy for a parent governor to join our LGB.

Becoming a governor is a very rewarding and worthwhile experience. Effective governors do not need expertise in education but do need to be committed to their school, willing to ask questions and offer appropriate challenge and support.

All governors are expected to:

- attend termly (roughly) evening meetings of the LGB
- attend development sessions which are usually once a term
- visit the school formally for monitoring purposes

Governors also need to be able to work as an enthusiastic member of the governing body team with the aim of raising and maintaining high educational standards for all children. Governors are asked to act with integrity, honesty and objectivity and at all times in the best interests of the school. The prime focus of the LGB is to develop the strategic direction of the school, be accountable to stakeholders and to ensure that financial resources are spent appropriately. Governors also have a number of opportunities to access training to develop and enhance their knowledge and skills. It is important to note that governors are elected to bring the experience of that individual as a member of the LGB. Once elected, parent governors are a representative parent but not a delegate. This means they are not expected to report back to parents on any matters relating to the school or LGB without prior consent from the governing body

Nomination requires that each candidate provide a brief personal statement of up to 200 words in length, covering a little information about the candidate and why they would like to be a governor. Should there be more than one nomination for the vacancy, there will be a parent ballot and all personal statements will be shared with parents, to help them decide how to vote.
