Beginning our English learning journey into biographies, the children enjoyed exploring lots of different examples, as well as finding out more about famous people from history and the modern day. Thursday has been a fun-filled day with word costumes galore and first-aid training for the Year 6 children! Here's to keeping up the amazing work in Year 5/6 this term - it will all be worth it!



## **Year 4/5**



In Anthony Horowitz class we spent some time last week sharing our amazing Banksy biographies. The whole class put so much hard work into them and the results were amazing. Those who wanted to, had the opportunity to share them with the whole class. It was a really lovely opportunity to share their hard work and celebrate their brilliant Banksy biographies. We have now started our new English unit which is all about

creating a Tudor short story that has an interesting twist; I am very excited to see how the turn out!

An exciting investigation is well underway in our Year 4 Science class. We are learning all about teeth this week and are investigating how sugar can cause tooth decay. For this investigation, students planned how we could use eggshells, which are very similar to teeth, to explore the impact of sugar on our teeth. We have left eggshells in coke cola, orange juice and water to see what we happen



over a week. Some students have left the eggshells in water with different amounts of sugar to create a fair test as comparison. We shall see what the results are next week!

### Year 3/4



On Thursday, it was World Book Day. The children in Year 3/4 enjoyed visiting Year 1 to take part in reading with a buddy.



The children were helping one another read and talking about their books enthusiastically. Year 3/4 loved being illustrators by doing the Draw Along online event for the book 'Dave the Pigeon' by Swapna Haddow and illustrated by Sheena Dempsey.





# Word of the week!



Etymology: Latin meaning to increase.


