Punctuality and attendance reminders


We have seen a huge improvement in the number of children arriving on time – thank you! However, we have started to see a few more children arriving late this week towards the end of term

Focus on.... VAT Directors and LGB visit

Last week we were delighted to welcome a group of Directors and Governors to school, who were overwhelmingly positive about Thameside. We wanted to share some of their comments:

We were all very impressed by the whole atmosphere of the school, the calm classrooms, the bright surroundings, and the dedication you and your team are bringing to your roles.

Beth Taylor, Chair of the Board of Directors (VAT)

It was a pleasure to notice evidence of many strengths:

- How well engaged children are across the whole school.
- How calm and purposeful the classrooms are, with evidence of respectful and positive relationships between children and between staff and children.
- How the Thameside 10 (teaching strategies) are being used to good effect in the classrooms – such as talk partners, focus on subject vocabulary, questioning by teachers that extended the challenge for children.
- Additional adults in the classrooms were focussed and enabling the children's learning by skilled questioning and guidance.
- Children articulating their learning and in many cases, they could explain why its important (for example why it's important to be able to tell the time).
- Classroom displays that are focussed on the process of learning (known as working walls) and also include examples of children's work to celebrate their efforts.

Thameside Science Fair!

Last week all the children in KS1 and KS2 took part in the Thameside Primary School Science Fair. It was a great opportunity for children to explore their own science ideas in their own way

and to share their findings with others.

During the week, children worked in pairs to investigate a science problem. The problems ranged from fixing a hole in a wellington boot to investigating problems involving microplastics.

On Friday, the children and the teachers visited all the exhibits and talked to the children about their work and what they had learned.

Mrs Cottrell was impressed with all the exhibits but had to choose a winner from each category. She said it was a really difficult decision.



The finalists from Thameside will join finalists from 11 other primary schools from Abingdon, Wantage and Faringdon, for a Science Fair at Rutherford Laboratories.

Year 5/6

The hard work continues as we head towards half-term! Authors in the making, we have been working hard on writing, editing and improving this week - our creatures at the mouth of the cave were really quite frightening but our animals are amazing, probably the most important in the world! Continuing our 'protecting the planet' work in Geography, we became explorers looking



for supplies of minerals around the world - did you know that salt is a mineral too? Also, that diamonds are made out of carbon? The world really is an amazing place! We were taken back to our younger years in Art this week, using Playdough to explore techniques which will help us to sculpt and decorate our vases in Art - we even had a little bit of time to come up with some of our own creations using the techniques!

Year 4/5

This week, we were incredibly proud of JJ and Grace, who won the Science Fair with their fantastic investigation about micro-plastics. They investigated what would be the most effective material as a net to filter different sizes of microplastics – we loved the responsibility that they showed as part of their eco-themed entry. The children have also been working hard to develop their description in preparation for writing their dragon-themed non-chronological reports. Finally, the Year 4s completed their mock Multiplication Check this week; the work that they have put into TimesTableRockstars was clearly evident and they have made huge progress this year – **please do keep practising over half term**. I wonder who can beat Mr McDowell's time (so far, he is the teacher with the quickest time per question!)

Year 3/4

Last week, Michael Morpurgo class set up a class science fair. Working in pairs, the

children generated a scientific question they wanted to investigate, planned their experiment, set it up and recorded their results. The children spent time discussing and explaining their results, and then evaluated their experiment. On Friday, it was brilliant to see children from other year groups visit our class science fair and Year 3/4 scientists share their learning. It was lovely to see the



enthusiasm and enjoyment being shared between the different year groups.

Year 2



Children in Year 2 have showed so much resilience in their SATs this week. Their 'can - do attitude' and their positive

mindset has been rather impressive! This week we completed our fantastic and well-illustrated Missing Posters for Mr Penguin using noun phrases as well as some question sentences. We also described a scene from our 'HERMELIN

THE DETECTIVE MOUSE BOOK' by using different sentence openers and some apostrophes. We will start planning our own stories soon with emphasis on the beginning, middle and end of our stories.

Science week has been absolutely brilliant. Our prediction was based on what happens when oil and water is mixed together by making our own Lava lamps. Children enjoyed making their lava lamps in groups and there were some really meaningful collaborations!!



Year 1

We have been working really hard in Maths this week. We have been learning to count in 2s, 5s and 10s. We



started this by thinking about equal groups and how we could put counters into equal groups. We started with 12 counters



and put them into groups of 1,2,3,4 and 6. It was quite hard to make sure we had found all the groups.

We also finished writing our amazing stories about a beanstalk. Miss Cross bound them into books for us so they looked really special. It was great fun reading them to our parents.

Reception



What a brilliant six weeks we have had in Reception! It has been a pleasure to have a full term with your children and see the progress they are all making. Proud teacher alert! May I start by saying a big thank you for all adults that came into to help build our Bug Hotel! If you didn't manage to make it in that day, please take your child into the garden at pick up and let them show off our brilliant Bug Hotel!


Thank you for your support with your child's learning and as always please do get in contact if you have any questions or queries.



Definition - an action or strategy carefully planned to achieve a specific goal.


Etymology- from Greek 'tactos' meaning ordered or arranged
