Dear Parents and Carers.

Happy New Year! I hope that you have had a positive start to 2024 and enjoyed a lovely Christmas. It has been wonderful to see our children back at school, raring to go for the new term! Thank you to everyone who supported children with their reading, Numbots and TTR over the break – even just 5 minutes each day makes a huge difference to children's learning and retention.

This coming term is short, but as always, very busy! I have been very impressed with the children's engagement in class and how hard they are already working – well done! It is always a

pleasure to walk around and see the children's pride and excitement in showing me their learning (and handing out Team Thameside stickers!

Yesterday, we welcomed the VAT EYFS Lead and another experienced EYFS practitioner to conduct a robust review of our EYFS provision. We were delighted with the feedback about the quality of education we offer to our youngest pupils and the developments made. In particular, our Nursery provision was praised for being, 'exceptional', which was wonderful to hear!

A huge well done to Mrs Hendry, Mr Dineen and the whole Early Years team – Team Thameside! Our favourite quote from the day captured the essence of our approach in both Nursery and Reception:

'The care guidance and support offered is palpable.'

Year 6 have also taken part in the IMPs training this term which taught them about using basic first aid and what to do if someone is in trouble – a key aspect of teaching children to stay safe. They have also reassured me that they will look after me if anything were to happen! The VAT Music festivals rehearsals are in full swing as well – the children were buzzing after the first rehearsal with Mr Campbell!

Our in in school and after-school clubs continue to inspire our children and provide some fantastic enrichment. This term we are running chess club for the whole of lunch break on a Friday allowing for more time to have matches and play different people. Children are allowed to eat their lunch and play if they would like to. Last week, we had an amazing 16 chess players with some really exciting and close matches. It is brilliant to see so many budding young chess players within our school.



In other news, we are pleased to share that we have secured a grant to provide parent Maths classes with a view to enabling parents and carers to support Maths at home as well as developing your own confidence – more news on this coming soon!

Finally, Cleal's Wheels (who have provided our cycling club) will be running a holiday camp here at TS during February – please see the banner on our gate for more details.

Thameside in Touch will then be sent out every three weeks to provide updates on what the children have been learning and other more detailed aspects of school life (twice per small term).


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

Focus on.... Our Learning to Learn skill of Noticing

As part of our 5R values, each term we focus on a new skill that helps our children learn. This term we are focussing on 'Noticing' which is an aspect of developing resilience in learning through supporting children to pay attention to and maintain focus on what they are learning.





Learning often requires us to pay attention to what we are interested in: not necessarily thinking about it, just really noticing how it looks, what it is made of, or how it behaves. This also includes being able to identify the significant detail, which often can take time to identify. The skill of noticing is improved with practice and we often learn this skill from people around us, for example,

babies learn to work out what their mother is focusing on, and to 'share joint attention' with her.

At Thameside this term, children have been reading a variety of books about this skill and taking part in activities – for example Nursery have been looking very carefully for flowers around the school.

Year 6

Year 6 have been incredibly busy this week and started the term with great enthusiasm. We had a visit from Thames



Valley Police to complete a workshop on 'protective behaviours, which the children engaged



with and asked lots of interesting questions. Also, we had a visit from IMPs (Injury Minimisation Programme), and we learnt about the recovery position, AED (Automated External Defibrillator) and how to minimise the chance of injuries. Mrs

Youngman was also incredibly impressed with the children's mature discussion

in their first RE lesson of the term, where we were talking about the concept of 'eternity.'

Year 5

Getting back into the swing of things after the Christmas break, Year 5 have been thrown straight into their learning this term! We have been making lots of links between our English, Science and Geography learning, although the children were not impressed when their paper village was flooded and destroyed by melting icebergs!

The next couple of weeks are going to be very busy for us all with swimming every day, Oxford Playhouse script sessions as well as designing and making a floating garden and ecothemed vase in art!



Year 4

These past few weeks, Year 4 have been busy learning all about the life and work of famous pop art artist Andy Warhol, who we will be writing biographies about to accompany our Warhol inspired art pieces. This week we got into character for our spoken language lessons where we had a go a creating a podcast with an Andy Warhol expert who had some exciting news about a discovery of a missing piece of art. The children did and absolutely amazing job and I am sure we have some future podcasters or radio presenters in the class.

This term, we have also been working really hard with our spelling. By the end of Year 4 there are roughly 100 statutory spelling that the students are expected to know, these are some of those tricky words that we all struggle to spell. We have been assessing which ones we can already spell accurately and which ones we need to focus on. This will really help narrow down those




Library Corner

We aim to reply to you within one working day and you should get an immediate message back to confirm we have received your text. Texts will only be seen between 9am and 5pm, Monday-Friday excluding Bank Holidays. If you need help before you hear back from us contact your GP, nearest walk in centre or dial 111. Our text number does not receive voice calls or MMS picture messages. Your messages are stored and can be seen by other health care staff who follow the same confidentiality rules.

We support messaging from UK mobile numbers only (which does not include messages sent from landlines, international mobile numbers and some 'number masking' mobile apps). We might inform other relevant professionals if we were concerned about your safety, but we would usually speak to you first. To prevent the health professional from sending messages to you, text STOP to our number. Messages are charged at your usual rates.

NSPCC Learning

Let children know you're listening

A safeguarding resource to help you show children and young people that, whatever they want to share, you're ready to listen.

There are three simple directions to remember...

> Show you care, help them open up

Give them your full attention and keep your body language open and encouraging. Be compassionate, be understanding and reassure them their feelings are important. Phrases like "you've shown such courage today" help.

> Take your time, slow down

Respect pauses and don't interrupt them – let them go at their own pace. Recognise and respond to their body language. And remember that it may take several conversations for them to share what's happened to them.

> Show you understand, reflect back

Make it clear you're interested in what they're telling you. Reflect back what they've said to check your understanding – and use their language to show it's their experience.
