We also welcomed the Headteacher of John Blandy School, who carried out a review of our teaching. Suzanne commented:

Thank you so much for this morning. I have really enjoyed being part of your review and came back with lots of enthusiasm speaking so highly of your leadership and school.

Other feedback included:

- ✓ *All children could identify what to do when they were stuck using friend first and then their teacher. They also said that the working wall helps them.*
- ✓ *Modelling was a strength of all teachers*
- ✓ *In lessons, the Thameside Ten (teaching strategies) was visible in practice in all lessons*
- ✓ *Teachers were able to speak of their research driven pedagogy and spoke highly of it.*

We finished the term with a fantastic Easter Egg hunt designed by Mrs Hendry (and our Nursery children!) – our local PCSO's even joined in with the fun!

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Focus on.... School development priorities update!

We are always looking to improve and grow our school in order that we can provide the very best education to our pupils. In this end of term edition, we wanted to share some examples of the work that we have done this year so far:

- ✓ Our Early Years Team have worked with the trust Early Years lead to continue to make our Early Years the very best it can be – this has included implementing some new ideas into the classroom and attending the latest phonics training
- ✓ Our staff have benefited from working with National Experts to develop the quality of teaching – this has been through the White Knights Phonics and BBO Maths hub. Staff have really valued this coaching and support.



- ✓ We have secured grants to help us further develop our learning environment – this includes a grant to enable us to repaint the murals near the field. We can't wait to get started; Mrs Shiraz is currently reviewing all of our children's amazing ideas to create two final designs!

- ✓ We have invested in lots of new phonics resources – we were delighted that so many parents have bought flashcards to use at home!
- ✓ We have continued to extend our curriculum enrichment and clubs – this has included work with the Oxford Playhouse for Year 5; visits from Radley Zoo; a variety of visiting speakers and author visits. Our clubs have also been well attended – origami and chess have been firm favourites!
- ✓ We have continued our focus on wellbeing – this has included a staff wellbeing charter and a pupil version, created by our Year 6 pupils (led by our



Mental Health Ambassadors, Evaldo and Sonny). These can be found on our website and were shared as a model of best practice in the trust!

Nursery Community Mural project!

We had a lovely time working with **MakeSpace** last week and worked together to create pieces of art around our school. Hopefully, you have seen our new creations in the school grounds. The nursery mural was a collaboration of children's designs and the local artists, Jordan, Jess and Tom and had the focus of community. Children from years 1-6 were involved with the painting. Have a look at our photos!

You may have noticed a range of beautiful flowers on our school gates and fences. Jess, worked with small groups of children to create their own flowers to decorate our grounds using material. After school, it was a delight to see so many children involved with Tom's street artwork in the hall. We had the best week and we are very excited to work with MakeSpace again!

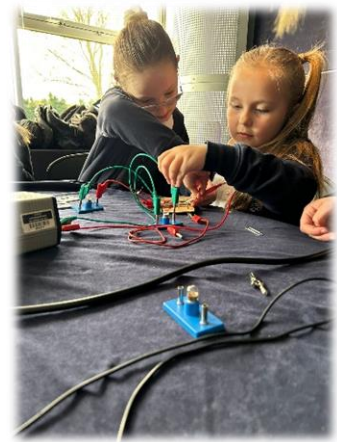
Year 6

Year 4

It has been one of the busiest few weeks for us in Year 4. We have had an amazing time learning how to make biscuits. Year 3

Year 3 have shown how much they learn from some of the extra activities in school over the last few weeks. Their trip into Abingdon on World Book Day



included the opportunity to choose a free book with their World Book Day vouchers. It's been lovely to hear the children then recommending titles to each other. Another highlight has been the D&T food technology project. All the children participated with enthusiasm in the taste testing of ingredients for their seasonal vegetable tarts. It was a delight to see so many children trying lesser-known



vegetables, like red beetroot, and then safely peeling and chopping them for their own seasonal creations. **Hot off the press..... Year 3 also met the author of the book they have been exploring as part of their writing unit; she even set them a challenge!!**

Year 2

Year 2 have had a really busy week. They finished typing up their letters to the mayor explaining what they each think could be improved about Abingdon. The children are very excited to send these off and fingers crossed we get a reply! In Maths, they have learnt about measures – measuring length, weight and capacity. The children have learnt all about how to use a ruler for measuring the length of something accurately and how to use scales to check the weight of an item.

Year 1

Wow! What a busy time we have had in Year One. We have loved our phonics lessons and have been 'cracking' the reading code! That means we have been learning lots of new sounds. Sometimes we learn two sounds in

one day! We are all getting really good at remembering all the different sounds and thinking about which sounds the letters make when they are in a word.

We are very proud to say that we know over 100 sounds now!

Keep practising with your phonics cards at home. If you did not buy a set at parents evening and would like a set, they are still available from Miss Cross for £5. The pack includes all the sounds the children need to know to pass the phonics screening check.

Miss Cross hopes you all have a lovely Easter break – don't forget to complete your phonics booklet. Remember if you complete it, you get 50 Dojos AND a Headteacher sticker from Mrs Youngman!!



Reception

What a brilliant term in Superworms! It has been brilliant to see the children's progress, especially with writing in our secret writing club! This term the children have been learning about life cycles and most recently we have been observing frogspawn grow into tadpoles. Let children know you’re listening

A **safeguarding resource** to help you show children and young people that, whatever they want to share, you’re ready to listen.
There are three simple directions to remember...

➤ Show you care, help them **open up**

Give them your full attention and keep your body language open and encouraging. Be compassionate, be understanding and reassure them their feelings are important. Phrases like “you’ve shown such courage today” help.

➤ Take your time, **slow down**

Respect pauses and don’t interrupt them – let them go at their own pace. Recognise and respond to their body language. And remember that it may take several conversations for them to share what’s happened to them.

➤ Show you understand, **reflect back**

Make it clear you’re interested in what they’re telling you. Reflect back what they’ve said to check your understanding – and use their language to show it’s their experience.
