Nursery

Children in Nursery have settled in brilliantly! They really enjoyed listening to 'The Gruffalo' story and decorated snakes, owls and Gruffalos. They also made the Gruffalo out of clay and loved making Gruffalo crumble! Children acted out how the characters in the story moved (slithered like a snake, squeaked like a mouse).

Reception

This week Reception have been exploring their new environment, both indoors and outside. They have learnt some class rules and have been talking about what makes a good listener. They have also been busy making new friends and learning each other's names!

Year 1

Year 1 have been reading 'Harry and the Dinosaurs go to school.' We have thought about what happens in the story and looked at the different characters. We are getting ready to write our own stories about toys at school!

Year 2

It has been a great start to term in Year 2! It has been great to get to know the children and have lots of fun learning, striving to always try our best. So far, we have got stuck into Winnie the Witch from our class author Valerie Thomas, started to learn about place value in Maths, seasons in Geography along with lots of other exciting topics. Year 4/5

Last week, Anthony Horowitz class spent some time getting to know one another through various team building activities and challenges focusing on our learning to learn value of perseverance. The students were tasked with the challenge to make a self-supporting bridge (Da Vinci Bridge) only using wooden dowels (no string, glue or anything else just wooden dowels) – this certainly took perseverance after it collapsed several times!

This week, Year 4s were learning about states of matter in Science. Together we learnt about solids, liquids and gases. We learnt how volume and shape vary depending on the different states. The students worked scientifically to identify and classify different materials, grouping them if they believed the material was either a solid, liquid or a gas.

Year 5/6

Year 5/6 have been entering the world of crime this week! The class have been solving 'Who Done It' puzzles using inference skills, as well as getting to know Nik and Norva, the main characters in our class reader *High Rise Mystery*. Using the learning power of *perseverance*, the children have been tackling some challenging learning in English, Maths and Science, which has made Miss Clark and Mrs Russell extremely proud!




Library Corner!

Our book recommendations are about other inspiring grandparents!




Non-Fiction recommendation: 'One Hundred Steps', illustrated by
