


# Abingdon School Science Workshops

Year 3 had a delightful morning during their light workshop at Abingdon School's laboratory. The children made their own shadow puppets to investigate how shadows change



depending on the position of the light source. They enjoyed investigating how two mirrors put at different angles changed a reflection of an object. For the final activity, they used three coloured lights to make other colours. It was great fun exploring the colours and talking about how our eyes can only see three colours.



Year 4 were in for a 'shock' with their electricity science workshop! The workshop began with students using balloons to create static electricity. As you can imagine this led to lots of crazy hairstyles. They learnt how static electricity can attract other objects. The next activity involved charging a balloon and a straw, which when placed near each other caused them to repel.

# Achievements outside of school!



We love to celebrate achievements outside of school so please do let us know if your child has achieved something special!


## Library Corner!


